Welcome to Social Studies 9! Over the next 5 months, we will explore a variety of concepts related to Social Studies. Social Studies 9 is the foundation for Social Studies 10 and consecutive Social Studies and History courses.

By the end of this course, you will have developed an important foundation of skills, attitudes, knowledge and respect for Social Studies.

The Big Ideas that you need to be able understand are as follows:

- 1. Emerging ideas and ideologies profoundly influence societies and events.
- 2. The physical environment influences the nature of political, social, and economic change.
- 3. Disparities in power alter the balance of relationships between individuals and between societies.
- 4. Collective identity is constructed and can change over time.

The Big Ideas will be developed by considering the following topics, which will be covered in various degrees of detail over the course.

- political, social, economic, and technological revolutions
- imperialism and colonialism, and their continuing effects on indigenous peoples in Canada and around the world
- global demographic shifts, including patterns of migration and population growth
- nationalism and the development of modern nation-states, including Canada
- local, regional, and global conflicts
- discriminatory policies and injustices in Canada and the world, such as the Head Tax, the Komagata Maru incident, residential schools, and World War I internment
- physiographic features and natural resources in Canada
